Call to Order – Chair Judy Gentner called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

<u>Privilege of the Floor</u> – Jack Donato expressed his appreciation to the Board of Trustees and thanked College Administration for a collaborative, productive and collegial negotiations process.

JCC Foundation Update

Trustee Beth Fipps stated that the Foundation has not met since the last Board of Trustees meeting; there is no report.

College Senate Update

Dr. Stone briefly reviewed the written report submitted by Joshua Hammond from the December 6 Senate Meeting. There were no questions.

Student Trustee Update

Dr. Stone briefly reviewed the written report submitted by Student Trustee Dioseline Osorio. There were no questions.

President's Report

Dr. Stone updated Trustees on COVID-related matters, recent activities, accolades and upcoming events. Highlights include:

- New mandates from the state with regard to the return of students to campus. Students must test
 before classes start and regularly throughout the semester, and must get the COVID booster within 30
 days of eligibility.
- At this juncture, the campus is expected to begin its spring semester on time and in person.
- In December, five students were recognized for completing CDL-A training at the Lewis County Educational Center.
- Later in January, the College will recognize those who have completed the Home-based Childcare Training Program. So far, four home daycare businesses have already opened with more to open early in 2022 creating an additional 64 childcare slots in Jefferson and Lewis counties.
- The College was recently highlighted in two publications: The *Criminal Justice Investment Initiative Annual Report* included a success story featuring a formerly incarcerated Jefferson student who has completed his degree and is earning a living wage; the *Black River Initiative Newsletter* highlighted the College's Green Campus Entryway Project.

E-Sports Initiative: Dr. Corey Campbell, Vice President for Student Engagement and Retention, provided an overview (attached) of the College's new E-Sports strategic initiative, which will serve to recruit new students and engage/retain current students. Dr. Campbell reported on project scope, budget, staffing, goals, anticipated participation, benefits, timeline and the current SUNY esports landscape. Start-up costs will be paid for using stimulus dollars. There was discussion about staffing, and potential connections to academic pathways in the computer science area. The College will begin marketing e-Sports in fall recruitment advertising campaigns.

Budget and Planning Committee - Committee Chair Michael Crowley

Committee Chair Crowley noted that the Budget & Planning Committee met prior to the full Board meeting.

Trustee Crowley presented a budget amendment in Resolution 100-22 that acknowledges new funding for a CDL training program. Upon motion by Michael Crowley, seconded by Cindy Intschert, Resolution 100-22 was approved unanimously as follows:

CDL-A PILOT TRAINING PROGRAM GRANT

GRANT PERIOD: NOVEMBER 1, 2021 – DECEMBER 31, 2021

WHEREAS, funds have been received from Lewis County and the Workforce Development Initiative Inc. (WDI) to fund a pilot CDL-A training program;

WHEREAS, the funds will be used to pilot an accelerated program at the Lewis County Education Center to immediately train and place successful participants into employment and provide valuable information on how to design, market, and fund a CDL-A program for the North Country;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Jefferson Community College Board of Trustees hereby approves the following budget amendment:

Financial Statements – November 2021

EVP Dupee reviewed unaudited financial statements for November 2021. Revenue is down about \$1M as compared to last year. Expenses are up slightly year over year, primarily due to equipment and contractual costs. Dr. Dupee noted there is an additional \$3.4M in stimulus funding to recognize this year. On the balance sheet, cash is up considerably as compared to last year, also due to stimulus funding and the College is looking at additional investment options. There were no questions.

Upon a motion made by David Males, seconded by Terry Fralick, the Board unanimously accepted November 2021 financial reports.

Academic and Educational Services Committee - Committee Chair David Males

Trustee Males noted that the Academic & Educational Services Committee met on December 15, 2021. He advised that the committee received an overview of the proposed e-Sports program and was supportive of the initiative. Trustee Males also reported that the College is beginning the accreditation process with the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. Jefferson's next accreditation visit is scheduled for 2024. In preparation for that visit, the College recommends a steering committee to assist with the tasks associated with the accreditation process.

Trustee Males presented Resolution 102-22 appointing members of the campus community to the Middle States Steering Committee. Upon motion by David Males, seconded by Terry Fralick, the Board approved Resolution 102-22 unanimously as follows:

Kerry Young, Associate Vice President for Human Resources, presented Resolution 103-22, which approves all provisions to a new employment agreement with the Faculty Association of Jefferson Community College (FAJCC) and authorizes the chair of the Board of Trustees to execute the four-year contract with the FAJCC. AVP Young reviewed key contract changes and noted the contract was supported overwhelmingly by the FAJCC who approved it with an 88-1 vote.

Upon motion by Nathan Hunter, seconded by Beth Fipps, the Board approved Resolution 103-22 unanimously as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. 103-22: APPROVAL OF EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT FACULTY ASSOCIATION of JCC

WHEREAS, a tentative employment agreement has been arrived at through collective negotiations between the Faculty Association of Jefferson Community College (FAJCC) and Jefferson County / Jefferson Community College;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Jefferson Community College Board of Trustees hereby approves said tentative employment agreement as attached and authorizes the Chair of the Board to execute said agreement on behalf of the Board.
