Updates

• JCC Foundation – Beth Fipps

The Faculty and Staff Campaign closed at the Senate meeting on February 4, 2020, resulting in 72 gifts totaling \$21,595. Renewal letters for 2020 Sponsorship program were sent in early February. Also being contacted in March 2020 is a list of 25 new business that have also been identified as possible sponsors.

The Foundation is collaborating with the NNYCF to host a Jefferson-Can alumni and student event on April 1, 2020. Also, The Foundation is in the process of finding a new second-party vendor to service online giving and online event registration and is working with a donor screening service to further identify new major gift prospects. Trustee Widrick reported that the Student Government Association (SGA) held a Club Fair on February 26th in the Jules Commons and will be holding an American Red Cross blood drive from 11:30 to 4:30 P.M. in the Residential Halls on Thursday, April 23rd SGA. (See attached report)

• Senate President – Kim Sell

Senate president Kim Sell highlighted several points from the Senate report, including:

• Kim Sell reminded the campus that the Senate slate is now open. There are many opportunities to become involved with the work on campus.

Committee Reports:

• Positive vote for the Fire Technology program changes and a Repeat Policy update from Academic Standards.

• The Smoking Policy will be finalized over the next month and presented for a vote at the next Senate meeting. There have been campus forums and Student Government feedback to the Campus Life Committee for their consideration.

• The Senate positions that are open were presented for new members to selfnominate.

New Business:

• Parking and parking tickets issues were introduced as possible new business item. It will be discussed in the appropriate areas on campus.

Good of the Order:

• There was additional discussion and suggestions for everyone to be aware of their practices and habits due to the flu season—especially the Coronavirus. (See attached report)

President's Report

• Dr. Stone's Report – (See attached PowerPoint printout)

• Dayton Skyscraper Project – A travel art exhibit highlighting the work of African American artists honoring prominent African American Daytonians has selected Dr. Stone as a Dayton Skyscraper. Photos of the exhibit are retained in historic records of the city.

• Dr. Stone is one of sixteen contributing authors of a newly published book, Workforce Development. Fellow writers include Chancellors, Presidents, Deans, Directors from across the country. Four of these authors, including Dr. Stone, are scheduled to participate in a panel discussion at the 100th AACC Annual Conference this month.

• PRODi-G - Initiative by Governor and Chancellor to actively increase diversity in our faculty. Specifically, this initiative is to recruit underrepresented minorities and women in STEM fields. Jefferson was one of five community colleges awarded these funds, which cover 100% of the faculty's salary the 1st year, 50% the 2nd year, and 30% the 3rd year.

• Coronavirus Update – To date, there have been 2 confirmed cases in NYS. We are expanding our Emergency Response Plan to include COVID-19.

• Dr. Stone expressed her appreciation and sympathy for past board member, Allen L. Smith, who passed away on February 23, 2020. Mr. Smith served on the Board of Trustees from 1990-1999 and was a valuable supporter of the College.
