<u>Call to Order</u> – Chair Nathan Hunter called the meeting to order at 4:02 p.m.

Introduction of New Board Members:

Dr. Stone introduced the College's new Trustees, distinguished Jefferson alumna Cindy Intschert and business-owner Damon Draught. Chair Hunter welcomed them both to the Board of Trustees.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – On a motion made by Mike Crowley, seconded by Judy Gentner, the minutes of the December 2, 2020 meeting were approved unanimously.

<u>Privilege of the Floor</u> – None.

JCC Foundation Update

Trustee Beth Fipps reported the following:

- November 2020 Solicitation signed by Chair Nathan Hunter \$14,660 donations to date
- Employee Campaign 2020-2021 \$14, 868 donations and commitments to date
- Corporate Partnership Solicitation \$30,000 donations and commitments to date
- Lynise Lassiter has joined the JCC Foundation Board of Directors

A Trustee inquired as to whether there were goals for each campaign and if so, were they met. Ben Foster described how goals are established and the status.

Senate President Update

Senate met the day prior to the Trustee meeting and Senate President Josh Hammond provided a written report to Trustees that summarized the meeting. He highlighted a presentation on the New Student Experience being developed by a sub-committee of the Guided Pathways initiative. There are no action items for the Board this month. There were no questions.

Student Trustee Update

Student Trustee Kelvin Reyes reported that the Executive SGA / Assembly meeting dates have been established along with virtual office hours. He also welcomed new Trustees.

President's Report

Dr. Stone reported on the following:

- The College's strong response to the challenges created by COVID including testing of students/staff/faculty, hosting food distribution events, distributing CARES Act funding to students, and most recently becoming a state-approved vaccine point of dispensing point (POD)
 - This was a collaborative effort with many community partners and campus entities including facilities, IT, marketing and Nursing department staff and students
 - The College also hosted a Kinney's vaccine clinic which distributed 1000 first doses of the COVID vaccine with 32 nursing students gaining valuable experience and clinical hours toward their degree
- The start of the spring semester on January 25 (February 1 for in-person instruction) went smoothly with 85% of classes remote, 65 students in the residence hall - all of whom were tested before return and upon return to campus
 - o Pooled saliva surveillance testing will increase to weekly for the Spring semester
 - Spring enrollment is down 12%
- The College is receiving an additional \$4.6 million in the new federal stimulus package; \$1.1M is designated directly for students
- The hybrid work schedule is being extended until further notice

Additionally, Dr. Stone noted she was appointed as an Ambassador for the NYS Vaccine Equity Task Force and Regional Health Equity Task Force, as well as appointed to the City of Watertown Police Reform Task Force.

In closing, Dr. Stone reviewed the many things that the pandemic has brought to light, noting that they were not caused by COVID, but rather magnified by COVID. As with any industry, as technology shifts and environmental demand changes, the College will be ready to adapt, change, and continue to serve the needs of our community.

Dr., Maryrose Eannance, Interim Vice President for Academic Affairs, updated Trustees on activities pertaining to the College's Guided Pathways Strategy as it relates to equity. Guided Pathways is a powerful and proven student success initiative adopted by many institutions. It is one of the four foundations of the College's current strategic plan. VP Eannace noted the four pillars of Guided Pathways – to Clarify the Path, Enter the Path, Stay on the Path, and Ensure Learning. She presented data on overall graduation rate by race/ethnicity which showed significant disparity among different races and ethnicities. VP Eannace then provided an overview of the Jefferson Guided Pathways Committee and numerous sub-committees tasked with addressing onboarding/educational planning, meta-major development, technology integration, retention strategies, developmental coursework. Tasks that have been completed already in Year 2 of the strategic plan are noted in the attached presentation.

Trustee Crowley noted that the Budget & Planning Committee met prior to the full Board meeting.

Financial Statements

Vice President Dupee presented financials for November 2020 and December 2020 with detail provided on the more recent December financials.

As of December 31, revenues are down approximately \$1.4 million, mostly in tuition and \$500,000 in state aid, versus last year. Expenses are down \$1.2 million. Approximately \$800,000 in CARES Act funding has not been appropriated in this budget as of yet, nor has the new federal stimulus funding passed in December. A question was asked regarding restrictions on the stimulus funding; VP Dupee advised it appears the restrictions have loosened somewhat from the first CARES Act funding guidelines, however guidance is still being finalized. There were no additional questions or concerns.

Upon a motion made by Mike Crowley, seconded by David Males, the November 2020 and December 2020 financial reports were accepted unanimously.

<u>Academic and Educational Services Committee</u> Committee Chair Terry Fralick No report.

Facilities Committee - Committee Chair Pamela Beyor-Murtha

Trustee Beyor Murtha reported that the Facilities Committee met on January 14th. The GiGP Grant, put on hold in spring of 2020 due to the pandemic, is now moving forward. The College portion of the project is in the budget. In addition, the current facilities master plan (FMP) expired in 2020. The Facilities Committee concurs with VP Dupee's recommendation to update the FMP for 2020-2025 conservatively with primary focus on revitalization and maintenance. The Bernier Carr Group has been asked to updated the FMP.
