

## Physical Education Teaching Degree

COOPERATIVE DEGREE PROGRAM AGREEMENT  
IN  
PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

This agreement establishes a Cooperative Degree Program Agreement between Jefferson Community College and SUNY College at Cortland. Students selected for matriculation in this program will, upon completion of a prescribed sequence of courses leading to an associate degree from Jefferson Community College, continue their studies at SUNY College at Cortland with the expectation that they may complete all requirements for a corresponding baccalaureate degree with the completion of 60 semester credit hours.

Students who are enrolled in a teacher certification program will probably need greater than 60 credit hours and possibly an additional semester or more at SUNY Cortland before they meet all the requirements for graduation and initial certification.

**STUDENT SELECTION**

The Admissions Office at Jefferson Community College will be responsible for the selection of candidates for admission to this cooperative degree program. In general, applicants will be expected to present strong records of academic achievement including four years of English, three years of social studies and mathematics, and at least two years of study in science. In addition, Jefferson Community College will designate appropriate prerequisites for matriculation in the curriculum included in this cooperative degree program.

Candidates selected for the program will receive, concurrently, a letter of admission from the Admissions Office at Jefferson Community College and a letter of admission from the Admissions Office at SUNY College at Cortland establishing their eligibility to matriculate in corresponding baccalaureate programs upon completion of degree requirements at Jefferson Community College. In addition, students selected for the program will be advised in the letter of admission of any special conditions, which may affect their eligibility to continue studies at SUNY College at Cortland.

**BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAM / TEACHING CERTIFICATION**

The following academic major and certification program at SUNY College at Cortland will be selected by students who enroll in this cooperative degree program. For automatic admission, students must achieve the minimum GPA indicated below.

## **GPA REQUIREMENTS**

In no instance shall a student graduating with an associate degree from Jefferson Community College be expected to meet a higher GPA standard than a SUNY College at Cortland student entering junior status.

In the case of programs that are not covered by this cooperative agreement, Jefferson Community College students must follow normal procedures for transfer admissions and will be required to file departmental applications upon acceptance to the College. Students will be subject to the same requirements for these programs as other students applying, including those having completed lower division work at SUNY College at Cortland.

## **STUDENT ACADEMIC ADVISEMENT**

Jefferson Community College staff will assume responsibility for advising students who enroll in the cooperative degree program. The attached curriculum guide sheets will be used as the mechanism for communicating degree requirements to students. Guide sheets will be reviewed annually and appropriate revisions to guide sheets will be made as each institution adds, deletes, or changes course offerings.

Staff members from the Office of Admissions, Transfer and Placement Office, and Counseling Center at Jefferson Community College and SUNY College at Cortland will be designated as contact persons and coordinators of this cooperative degree program agreement.

## **ARTICULATION PROCEDURES**

Participants in the cooperative degree program are not required to file an application for admission to SUNY College at Cortland. However, in order for officials at SUNY College at Cortland to develop a candidate selection plan for each semester, students who anticipate enrolling at SUNY College at Cortland under the auspices of this agreement must file a Notice of Intent to Enroll with the Office of Admissions at Cortland prior to beginning their studies at the College. For the fall term, the Notice of Intent must be filed by April 1; for the spring term, it must be on file by November 15. All students matriculated in the cooperative degree program at Jefferson Community College will be sent a copy of the Intent to Enroll form at the beginning of their final semester of study at Jefferson Community College.

No tuition deposit will be required of students who plan to continue their studies at SUNY College at Cortland. However, students who wish to reside in campus residence halls will be required to submit a \$150 deposit fee by May 1 for fall semester and December 1 for spring semester.

## **INFORMATION SHARING**

Jefferson Community College will provide SUNY College at Cortland with periodic reports so that officials at each college can monitor the flow of students through the program. Biographic data on each student will be provided to the admissions staff at SUNY College at Cortland so that literature and other relevant programmatic information can be sent to students during the time that they are pursuing their studies at Jefferson Community College.

In lieu of information that would be provided on an application for admission, Jefferson Community College will provide any relevant data for the establishment of student records at Cortland, including a copy of each student's official transcripts from all previous colleges

(regardless of whether credit has been awarded toward a degree program at Jefferson Community College). Conversely, SUNY College at Cortland will provide reports on the academic progress of students who subsequently matriculate at the College. (All students matriculated in this degree program must sign a consent statement authorizing the release of all appropriate academic and biographic information.)

### **CHANGES IN DEGREE REQUIREMENTS**

Students enrolled in the program who maintain continuous registration will not be affected by any changes in the provisions of the agreement unless they deem such changes to be in their best interest. The guarantee of admission to SUNY College at Cortland will be honored for a two-year period after graduation from Jefferson Community College provided the student does not register for courses at another institution in the interim.

### **TIME FRAME AND PROVISION FOR PROGRAM REVIEW**

All students currently enrolled at Jefferson Community College and those admitted to begin their studies at Jefferson Community College in Fall 2003 through Spring 2007 are eligible to be considered for this cooperative degree program.
